GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

April 6, 2025 5th Sunday Lent John 8:1-11

"The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle" (John 8:3). Why do they make her stand in the middle? Why not expose her on the periphery? The reason is something that affects us practically every day.

The center is what stabilizes a community's identity. We humans tend to center ourselves around an accused and condemned victim — though we rarely admit it. This renews our fragile communities and our power as those who weaponize the accusation. This is effective because it is often a victim who represents something truly dangerous for the group. In this case, adultery stands for the breakdown of a community and those within it, because it forces questions like: who is my father? Whose child is this? Is this child one of us, or that of an outsider? The accusers place the adulteress in the center because their community, like most, is built around turning an enemy into a victim.

Once you understand this, you'll see it almost anywhere humans group together (families, politics, workplaces, sports, schools, etc.). The good news is Jesus exposes this dynamic by deftly pointing out the sin-infected hearts of everyone besides the woman. They all leave, symbolizing the breakdown of the old order, and she is "left alone before him." A new community has begun, structured around the merciful love of Christ.

What is in your center? What is in the center of our parish and family communities? Strive to center on Christ's forgiveness, and we experience the new, lasting community we call the Church.



What Is a Mass Intention?

A Mass intention is a specific petition for which the Mass is offered. Mass intentions are most commonly offered in remembrance of a person who has died. It may seem counterintuitive to offer a Mass intention for a person who has died, as their time on earth is finished. However, the practice of offering Mass intentions for the deceased relates to the Catholic belief in purgatory.

As Catholics, we believe souls of those who die in a state of sin go through a purification process before entering heaven. We offer Masses for our deceased loved ones to aid them in their journeys to heaven. We pray with hope that the graces imparted by the Mass usher them further towards eternity with God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God" (CCC 1032).

It is especially important to pray for the dead, as they can no longer pray for themselves. Pope Francis said that offering the celebration of the Eucharist for the dead "is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to the most abandoned ones."

The graces acquired by having a Mass said for a special intention are beyond earthly comprehension. The Mass is the greatest prayer and therefore the most powerful means to help others and ourselves gain eternity with him.

Bringing Faith Formation into the Home

Our Faith Formation Classes ended this year on April 6th with an all-class Mass at 11:30am at Sacred Heart. A special thank you to our Catechists: Ana Haff, Sophia Gwinn, Kathy Herr, Maria Staehr, Nubé Staehr and Liza Kelly. We appreciate them sharing their gifts and talents with us. Thank you to Jack Kearse who assisted with the desk and Mackenzie Rumsey our 2nd grade assistant.

It's important that though formal instruction has ended, our work in Faith Formation does not end. Parents and family are the first and foremost instructors in Faith Formation. Growing in faith as a family doesn't have to involve hours of reading the Bible, studying Scripture and meditating. It can begin with simple prayers.

Here are a few hints:

Make time in your day. Make choices about how your family will change its schedule to make space for prayer time.

Create a ritual. Choose a specific time and place for daily devotions — whether it's breakfast, dinner or before bedtime.

Start simple. Begin with a simple, one-sentence prayer at meal like "Thank you God for this food" or a Bible story at bedtime.

Repetition is key. Your devotional time might feel messy and awkward but keep practicing.

Creating a habit is the goal, not perfection! Begin with a story or verse. Introduce your kids to the stories and concepts of the Bible.

Choose a verse to read and discuss or read a Bible story.

Pay attention. Look for God in everyday life.

Ask your family to share where they experienced or felt close to God during their day.

Practice Sabbath. Start small and spend 10-15 minutes as a family to be with God.

Turn off screens, pause from chores and do something fun.

Create a space for prayer. Provide a quiet, comfortable place with materials for writing or drawing along with a Bible and other devotional books.

Start a prayer journal. Use a simple notebook to write or draw pictures of what you want to pray about. Create a family journal or provide one for each member.

Model your own faith. Let your children see you reading Scripture, writing in a prayer journal, and praying aloud. Watching your practices will reinforce the importance of devotional time.

Most of all, remind your family of God's love on a daily basis. Start small and grow. You will be amazed at how your children will absorb their faith as you practice it as a family.
