GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

June 29, 2025 Sts. Peter And Paul, Apostles Matthew 16:13-19


What do you call brothers who are born on the same day? Twins, of course. That is what we celebrate today in the inestimable saints, Peter and Paul. Wait: twins? Yes. The early Church believed that Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome on the same day. Since the day of martyrdom is celebrated as a saints' birth into eternal life, the result is striking: Peter and Paul are twins in God's family, the Church.

Who should care about this? Well, anyone who longs to live in a world marked by love and peace. Remember, the Romans believed that twins, Romulus and Remus, founded their city through an act of fratricide, the former murdering the latter. Sadly, the structures of this fallen world emerge through violence between those who should love each other. But in the Church, a new city has been founded upon this new set of twins, embodying the non-violent power of Jesus' cross and resurrection.

That's why traditional icons represent Peter and Paul in a fraternal and warm embrace. Contrasted with the violence of Rome's founders, it challenges us with a bold claim: do we believe that structures of merciful love are more powerful and lasting than those based on power, violence, and domination? Am I willing to see others in my life as my "twin," with whom I am called to give my life for Christ, or as my rival? Am I committed to living what is embodied in Romulus and Remus, or in Peter and Paul?

New Mental Wellness Offering for Parishioners

"Prolonged Grief Treatment (PGT) is a treatment specifically designed to help people who feel stuck in their grief. Prolonged Grief (PG) is grief that continues to be intense and pervasive, disrupting everyday life for longer than a year. This happens to about 10-20% of bereaved people, with rates differing depending on who died, when they died and how they died. People experiencing PG often describe it as feeling "stuck" in grief or "frozen in time" as if the death had just happened. Grief dominates their thoughts and feelings, making it difficult to think about or concentrate on anything else."

"The treatment has a specified time frame and targets 6 Healing Milestones. Therapists trained by Columbia University Center for Prolonged Grief to do this treatment are skilled in meeting adult grievers where they are and helping them learn ways to accept their new reality and restore their wellbeing through gentle guidance. The individual therapy includes sharing and discussing information about grief and adapting to loss and the use of a series of activities that promote experiential learning."

Sunday, June 29, 2025 Summer with the Saints ... Who are Saint Peter and Saint Paul?

Saint Peter was one of the Twelve Apostles and the first Pope of the Catholic Church. He was a fisherman in Bethsaida in the region of Galilee when his brother Andrew invited him to meet Jesus. He became a disciple when Jesus called Peter and Andrew to leave their work as fishermen and follow him to become "fishers of men." Peter rose above the other Apostles as the leader of the Twelve when he showed the courage and wisdom to call Jesus the Messiah. Peter was born with the name Simon, but Jesus gave him the name Peter, which means "rock." Jesus called him the rock upon which he would build the Church. Although Saint Peter abandoned Jesus during the crucifixion, he was filled with joy about Jesus's Resurrection. He witnessed the Risen Jesus many times before his Ascension into heaven. At Pentecost, Peter and the other Apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit. Peter stood up and gave the first of many speeches and began to work miracles as the leader of the capital of the empire. There Peter was arrested with many other Christians for not worshiping Roman gods. He was crucified upside-down and buried in the same place where Saint Peter's Basilica stands today. Saint Peter is the patron saint of fishermen, net makers, and shipbuilders.

Saint Paul was originally known as Saul from Tarsus. Although he was not one of the Twelve Apostles selected by Jesus, he considered himself to be an Apostle, and he certainly made just as great an impact on the growth of the early Church as any of the Twelve. Saul was a Roman citizen and tentmaker by trade. He trained as a Pharisee to become an expert in Jewish Law. He was skeptical of Christians and arrested them as enemies of the Jewish people until he encountered Jesus himself in a vision on the road to Damascus. Paul was baptized and immediately began to preach the good news about Jesus. He travelled throughout the Mediterranean and started Christian churches and wrote letters back to Christian communities in Rome, Corinth, Ephesus, Philippo, Galatia, and more. These letters later became a large part of the New Testament. He was arrested many times by opponents of the Church and even spent two years in prison in Rome. Saint Paul was martyred like Saint Peter and many other Christians during the reign of the Roman Emperor Nero. Saint Paul is often depicted holding a sword because he died by decapitation. Saint Paul is one of many patron saints of missionaries, evangelists, writers, and public workers.

The feast day of Saints Peter and Paul is celebrated on June 29.
