GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

November 23, 2025
Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe
Luke 23:35-43

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). That word — remember — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, "You will be with me."

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today.

Sunday, November 23, 2025 ADVENT

Advent is a significant season in the Catholic liturgical calendar that marks the anticipation and preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas. It is a time of reflection and prayer when individuals and communities prepare their hearts and minds for the coming of Christ. Advent lasts for four weeks, beginning on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and culminating on Christmas Eve.

During this season — which actually marks the beginning of the liturgical year, rather than the end — Catholics around the world engage in various traditions and practices that enhance their spiritual preparation.

WHAT DOES ADVENT MEAN?

The term "Advent" originates from a Latin root meaning "arrival" or "coming." Each week of Advent corresponds to a particular theme of hope, peace, joy, and love, aligning with the liturgical readings and prayers of the season. This framework helps Catholics reflect on the significance of Christ's birth, his ministry, and his promise to return. The Advent season encourages believers to delve into their faith, foster a greater awareness of God's presence in their lives, and cultivate a spirit of gratitude and generosity as they prepare for Christmas.

WHEN DOES ADVENT START?

Advent begins each year on the Sunday nearest to November 30, which is the feast day of St. Andrew. The exact date varies each year. In 2025, Advent starts on Sunday, November 30.

HOW IS ADVENT CELEBRATED?

Advent is celebrated in various ways across different Catholic traditions. Common practices include the lighting of candles on an Advent wreath, attendance at church services, and daily prayer and Scripture readings.

WHAT DOES THE ADVENT WREATH SYMBOLIZE?

An Advent wreath is a circular arrangement of greenery that through its shape signifies the eternal nature of God's love and the promise of everlasting life through Christ, while the greenery symbolizes the renewal of life and hope.

The use of Advent candles is a prominent tradition that symbolizes the themes of the season. Generally, one candle is lit each week leading up to Christmas. The most common arrangement features four candles placed in a circular wreath, representing the four Sundays of Advent, with an additional candle in the center called the Christ candle, which is lit on Christmas Eve.

Each candle, lit progressively each week, reinforces the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love, allowing believers to engage in a visual and meaningful way with the spiritual aspects of the Advent season. Lighting each candle can become a cherished family tradition and a focal point for prayers and reflections during Advent.

WHAT ARE THE 4 THEMES OF ADVENT?

Advent encompasses four main themes, each representing a crucial aspect of the spiritual journey leading up to Christmas. Each of the four Sundays of Advent correspond to:

Hope: The first theme of Advent emphasizes the hope Catholics have in the coming of Christ, reminiscent of the anticipation of the Messiah in the Old Testament.


Peace: The second theme reflects on the peace Christ brings into the world, reminding believers to seek inner peace and foster peace with other people.

Joy: The third theme centers on the joy of the season, celebrating the birth of Christ and the joy found in Catholic community and fellowship.

Love: The final theme represents the selfless love of God, encouraging believers to embody love in their lives and relationships.

Next week, we will learn about the first week of Advent centering on the theme of HOPE.


